R UN away from the fubicriber in Albemarle, a Mulatto flave called Sandy, about 35 years of age, his flature is rather low, inclining to corpulence, and his complexion light; he is a fhoemaker by trade, in which he ufes his left hand principally, can do coarfe carpenters work, and is fomething of a horfe jockey; he is greatly addicted to drink, and when drunk is infolent and diforderly, in his converfation he fwears

much, and in his behaviour is artful and knavish. He took with him a white horse, much scarred with traces, of which it is expected he will endeavour to dispose; he also carried his shoemakers tools, and will probably endeavour to get employment that way. Whoever conveys the faid flave to me, in *Albemarle*, shall have 40 s. reward, if taken up within the county, 41. if elsewhere within the colony, and 101. if in any other colony, from THOMAS IEFFERSON.
